A shape-changing faerie who can appear as a human, cat, rabbit, or horse, among other creatures.



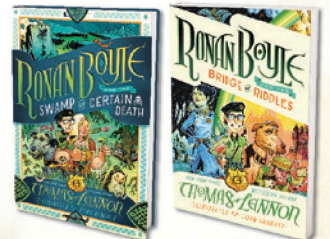
Changeling
